Conversion of Paul the Apostle



On January 25, we celebrate the Conversion of Saint Paul. St. Paul's conversion, from being an active Jewish leader and persecutor of early Christians to being perhaps the greatest Christian evangelist, occurred around 34–37 CE. While on that road Paul (that is his Latin name; his Jewish name was Saul) carried a letter that would allow him to persecute, even to death, any person who belonged to "the Way" (i.e., following Christ.) Paul, who notable for having participated in the stoning of St. Stephen, the 1st martyr, was in a "raging fury". (See, Acts 7:57–8:3, and 26:9). And then, suddenly a bright light shone on Saul, causing

him to fall to the ground and Jesus spoke to Saul, asking, "Why are you persecuting me?" Jesus' commissioned Saul to be His message of the forgiveness of sins and the promise of "a place among those who are sanctified by faith", to the Gentiles. (See, Acts 26).

Later, Paul wrote, "... you have heard of my previous way of life in Judaism, how intensely I persecuted the church of God and tried to destroy it. I was advancing in Judaism ... and was extremely zealous for the traditions of my fathers." (Galatians 1:13–14)
