February 2nd – Feast of the Presentation of Jesus at the Temple (Candlemas)

Candlemas (aka "Candlemass"), may also be known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or the Feast of the Holy Encounter! Under any of these names, Candlemas is based on the Biblical account of Jesus' presentation in the Temple (Luke 2:22–40), at which time his mother, Mary, would have sought ritual purification, by presenting a lamb, a young pigeon or a dove as a burnt offering. (Leviticus 12:1-8). Candlemas usually falls on or near February 2 ... 40 days after Christmas!

Some Christians remove their Christmas decorations on or about the Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve), while others choose Candlemas. On Candlemas, many Anglicans, Methodists, Lutherans, Orthodox and Roman Catholics bring their candles to their local church, where they are blessed and then used for the rest of the year, as symbols of Our Lord, Jesus Christ -- the Light of the World.
