Our Traditional Christmas Eve service is at 7:30pm.

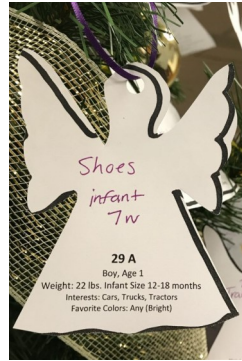
