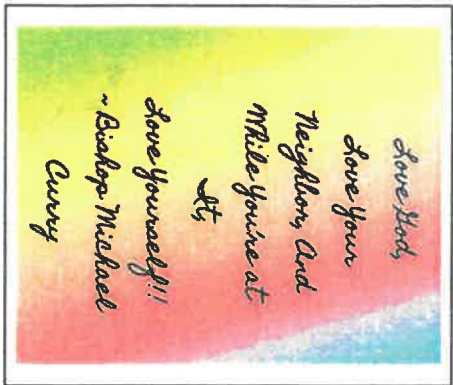


A New Discussion Class For Lent
