WHAT IS PENTECOST?

The word itself means “fiftieth”. Pentecost is 50 days after Easter and ten days after the Ascension of our Lord into heaven.

Jesus fulfilled his promise to send the Holy Spirit at Pentecost .

THE SEASON AFTER PENTECOST, ACCORDING TO THE CALENDAR OF THE CHURCH YEAR (BCP, P. 32). IT BEGINS ON THE MONDAY FOLLOWING PENTECOST, AND CONTINUES THROUGH MOST OF THE SUMMER AND AUTUMN. IT MAY INCLUDE AS MANY AS TWENTY-EIGHT SUNDAYS, DEPENDING ON THE DATE OF EASTER.

The Nicene Creed

BCP 358

All stand (as you are able) and say:

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, True God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: By the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the People - Form VI

BCP 392

The Leader and People pray responsively

Leader: In peace, we pray to you, Lord God.

Silence

Leader: For all people in their daily life and work;

People: ***For our families, friends, and neighbors, and for those who are alone.***

Leader: For this community, the nation, and the world;

People: ***For all who work for justice, freedom, and peace.***

Leader: For the just and proper use of your creation;

People: ***For the victims of hunger, fear, injustice, and oppression.***

Leader: For all who are in danger, sorrow, or any kind of trouble;

People: ***For those who minister to the sick, the friendless, and the needy.***

Leader: For the peace and unity of the Church of God;

People: ***For all who proclaim the Gospel, and all who seek the Truth.***

Leader: For Michael, our Presiding Bishop, Andy, Jeff, Hector, and Kai, our Bishops; and for all bishops and other ministers;

People: ***For all who serve God in his Church.***

Leader: Comfort and heal all those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit.

(Leader will read names of those who need special prayers)

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

BCP 364

Officiant and People together:

Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy Name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation,

but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom,

and the power, and the glory,

for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

BCP 364

Celebrant: Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People: ***Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia.***

Celebrant: The Gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.

The people stand or kneel.

Then the Celebrant continues

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen.

Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Leader: For the special needs and concerns of this congregation.

Silence may be kept or the People may add their needs and concerns aloud.

Leader: Hear us, Lord;

People: ***For your mercy is great.***

Leader: We thank you, Lord, for all the blessings of this life.

Silence may be kept or the People may add their thanksgivings aloud.

Leader: We will exalt you, O God our King;

People: ***And praise your Name for ever and ever.***

Leader: We pray for all who have died, that they may have a place in your eternal kingdom.

Silence may be kept or the People may add their own petitions aloud.

Leader: Lord, let your loving-kindness be upon them;

People: ***Who put their trust in you.***

Prayer for a new Rector (all together)

O God, giver of every good gift, who knows our needs, even before we ask, look graciously upon your whole church and upon St. Christopher's. Guide us to use the diverse gifts, talents, and skills with which you have blessed us that we may increase our commitment to one another and to the mission of Christ. Give us an open spirit and discerning hearts that we may trust Your will for us. Raise up for us a rector who will lead us to love, serve and grow in our congregation, in our community and in the wider church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for Those in the Armed Forces

BCP 823

Almighty God, we commend to your gracious care and keeping all the men and women of our armed forces at home and abroad. Defend them day by day with your heavenly grace; strengthen them in their trials and temptations; give them courage to face the perils which beset them; and grant them a sense of your abiding presence wherever they may be; through Jesus Christ our Lord. ***Amen.***

The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.

BCP 395

O Lord our God, accept the fervent prayers of your people; in the multitude of your mercies, look with compassion upon us and all who turn to you for help; for you are gracious, O lover of souls, and to you we give glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Confession of Sin

BCP 360

Celebrant: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Celebrant and People:

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Celebrant: Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. **Amen.**

The Peace *(All stand)*

Officiant: The Peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: **And also with you.**

Greet one another in the Lord's name by shaking hands, waving, etc.
